Procedure:

- Resident is able to verbalize indications, contraindications, risks, benefits of procedure
- Resident is able to verbalize the steps involved in the procedure
- Informs patient of procedure including risks and benefits and obtains consent (if appropriate)
- Observes universal precautions
- Positions patient properly
- Maintains proper sterile technique
- Uses ultrasound appropriately to identify vessel/patency (as needed)
- Central line flushed if appropriate
- Skin prep appropriate for procedure
- Appropriate local anesthesia
- Needle aimed at proper angle and direction
- Resident able to analyze and correct potential reasons for unsuccessful procedure
- Venous blood obtained
- Wire introduced and syringe removed
- Skin cut made prior to inserting catheter dilator
- Catheter inserted; wire withdrawn
- Confirmation of port function
- Catheter secured in place
- Proper dressing applied
- Patient cleaned up
- Sharps disposed of in appropriate container
- Confirmatory x-ray ordered and reviewed as necessary
- Procedure note written
